

What is a Tenebrae Service?

"Tenebrae" is a Latin word meaning "shadow of darkness." This ancient worship tradition, over 1600 years old, recounts the final events in the life of our Savior. With each step toward his death, a candle is extinguished, reminding us of the absence of Christ's light in the world while we await the hope of the resurrection.

Together, we will follow Jesus to the cross through scripture and song.
